The words chosen were selected from research and the author's experience working with children.

These are simply suggested words. They were designed as a starting place to build a child's vocabulary.

Children's first words will differ based on their environment and unique interests.

Family names, favorite toys and pets are often some of the first words a child will say.

Your child's first 50 words will likely have some that are not on this list.

How to use 50 First Words.

Chose a small set of words to work on at a time. This may be 1-2 or 3-5 depending on your child.

When helping a child learn their first words:

- Get their attention
- Repeat the word often
- Use short sentences
- Practice the word in different activities
- Use a visual such as an object, picture or sign language

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: have mom hide, ask "Where's mom?". She pops out and you say "There's mom!".
- Life Skills: when sorting laundry label clothes that belong to mom ex. Mom's sock, Mom's shirt.
- Books: find pictures of mom in photo albums.
- Books: show your child all the moms and mama animals in books.

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First Words dad

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: have mom hide, ask "Where's dad?". He pops out and you say "There's dad!".
- Life Skills: when sorting laundry label clothes that belong to dad, ex. Dad's sock. Dad's shirt.
- Books: find pictures of dad in photo albums.
- Books: show your child all the dads and dada animals in books.



First Words eat

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: use eat during snacks and meals.
- Play: pretend play with dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters.
- Books: find pictures of people and animals eating.
- Comment when you see people eating on TV or in movies.


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First Words drink

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: use drink during snacks and meals.
- Play: pretend play with dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters.
- Books: find pictures of people and animals drinking.
- Comment when you see people drinking on TV or in movies.

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: ask for more during snacks and meals.
- Play: request more bubbles, windup toys or blowing up balloons.
- Play: when playing tickle or blowing raspberries on tummy.
- Going Out: ask for more when playing on the swings.

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: use after snacks and meals.
- Daily Activities: after a diaper change, taking a bath or washing hands.
- Books: at the end of a story.
- Life Skills: during cleanup when putting away toys.
- Going Out: when leaving, ex. "All done park", "All done doctor", "All done library".






Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: yell "stop!" when chase/tag.
- Play: have toy cars, trucks, trains or other vehicles stop and go.
- Daily Activities: during bath time when splashing in the water.
- Daily Activities: tell your child "stop" if they are doing something they are not suppose to.
- Going Out: in the car when you stop.


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First Words

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: running, "Ready, set.... GO!"
- Play: have toy cars, trucks, trains or other vehicles stop and go.
- Play: passing a ball back and forth.
- Play: on the playground. Hold them and pause at the top of the slide or swings and encourage them to say "go" before letting go.
- Going Out: in the car when you start to go.

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: use help when getting dressed.
- Daily Activities: during snacks and meals, ex. pealing banana, cutting foods.
- Daily Activities: opening food packages or containers.
- Daily Activities: getting items out of reach.
- Play: wind-up toys, pull back cars, blowing up a balloon.
- Going Out: when opening doors.


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First Words open

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: opening food packages or containers.
- Daily Activities: opening doors, windows, cabinets and drawers.
- Daily Activities: taking tops of milk, juice, toothpaste etc.
- Play: doors and flaps on toys.
- Books: when opening book and lifting flaps.
- Going out: when opening doors.



First Words walk

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: when your child is walking.
- Play: pretend play with dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters.
- Books: find pictures of people and animals walking.
- Going Out: point out people and animals out for a walk.

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

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: when your child is running.
- Play: pretend play with dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters.
- Books: find pictures of people and animals running.
- Going Out: point out kids running at the park.



First Words play

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: ask your child "Want to play?"
- Daily Activities: use the word "play" with pets, ex. "Let's play with "
- Books: show your child pictures of characters playing.
- Going Out: comment on kids playing at the park, ex. "playing soccer".

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
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First Words ump

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: dance and jump to music.
- Play: set up an obstacle course and jump over objects like pillows.
- Daily Activities: comment when a pet jumps off furniture.
- Going Out: run and jump outside.
- Going Out: jump off playground equipment.




First Words baby

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: pretend play with dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters.
- Books: point to your child in baby pictures.
- Books: show your child all the babies and baby animals in books.
- Songs: sing Rock-a-bye Baby.
- Going Out: comment when you see a baby, "Look, baby".

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

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: look for pictures of cows on milk or yogurt containers.
- Play: play with toy farm animals, puppets and stuffed animals
- Books: read books about farms (both picture books and nonfiction)
- Songs: sing Old MacDonald Had a Farm.
- Going Out: visit a farm in your area.



First Words fish

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: play with fish in the bathtub or pool.
- Daily Activities: look for pictures of fish on crackers boxes. fish stick etc.
- Play: play Go Fish.
- Books: read books about fish (both picture books and non-fiction).
- Going Out: visit an aquarium or Z00.

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
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First Words duck

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: play with rubber ducks in the bathtub or pool.
- Play: play with toy farm animals, puppets and stuffed animals.
- Books: read books about farms (both picture books and nonfiction).
- Songs: sing Old MacDonald Had a Farm.
- Going Out: look for ducks at the park and zoo.



First Words dog

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: play with toy animals, puppets and stuffed animals.
- Play: pretend to be dogs, ex. eat, drink, bark and do tricks.
- Books: read books about dogs (both picture books and nonfiction).
- Songs: sing Bingo and Old MacDonald Had a Farm.
- Going Out: look for dogs in your neighborhood.

cat

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: play with toy animals, puppets and stuffed animals.
- Play: pretend to be cats, ex. eat, drink, bark and purr.
- Books: read books about cats (both picture books and nonfiction).
- Songs: sing Old MacDonald Had a Farm.
- Going Out: look for cats in your neighborhood.



First Words milk

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: drink milk during snacks and meals.
- Play: pretend play with dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters.
- Books: find pictures of people and animals drinking milk.
- Comment when you see people drinking on TV or in movies.

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First Words cookie

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Life Skills: make cookies together.
- Play: pretend to make and eat cookies with play dough.
- Play: have stuffed animals and dolls pretend to eat cookies.
- Books: find pictures of cookies in books.
- Going Out: look at the cookies in the grocery store or visit a bakery.



water

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: use water during snacks and meals.
- Daily Activities: talk about water when washing hands or in the bathtub.
- Play: pretend dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters are drinking water or playing in water.
- Books: look for water in books, ex. ocean or polls.

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First Words juice

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: drink juice during snacks and meals.
- Play: pretend play with dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters.
- Books: find pictures of people and animals drinking juice.
- Comment when you see people drinking juice on TV or in movies.



First Words apple

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: eat apples during snacks and meals.
- Play: have dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters eat apples during play.
- Life Skills: point to apples on packages when putting away groceries.
- Books: read books with apples. Going Out: find the apples in the grocery store.

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First Words banana

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: eat banana during snacks and meals.
- Play: have dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters eat bananas during play.
- Life Skills: point to bananas on packages when putting away groceries.
- Books: read books with bananas. Going Out: find the bananas in the grocery store.




First Words cereal

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: eat cereal during snacks and meals.
- Play: during pretend play with dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters.
- Life Skills: talk about cereal when putting away groceries.
- Life Skills: clean up cereal when it spills.
- Going Out: find the cereal in the grocery store.

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
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First Words book

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: make reading books part of your bedtime routine.
- Life Skills: put books away during clean up.
- Life Skills: follow directions, ex. "Get the book".
- Going Out: visit the library.




First Words ball

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: roll, bounce, throw, kick and pass a ball back and forth.
- Play: comment on toys with balls ex. ball and hammer, ball poppers
- Play: make balls out of play dough.
- Books: look for pictures of balls in books.
- Going Out: play with a ball at the park.

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First Words bubbles

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: playing with bubbles in the bathtub.
- Play: blow bubbles and pop, stomp and clap them.
- Daily Activities: talk about bubbles when washing hands.
- Life Skills: make bubbles in the sink and wash dishes together.
- Going Out: watch the bubbles as you go through a car wash.



tree

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: climb a tree.
- Books: look for trees in your favorite books.
- Books: get a book about seasons and talk about the trees.
- Going Out: go for a walk and look for animals in the trees.
- Going Out: play hide-and-seek behind trees.

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

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: talk about the sunlight as you clean the windows.
- Books: look for the sun in your favorite books.
- Books: get a book about the sun.
- Songs: Sing Oh Mr. Sun.
- Going Out: talk about the sun when you are out for a walk.



First Words shoes

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: talk about when putting on or taking off shoes
- Play: make a game of hiding and finding a shoe.
- Play: comment on dolls shoes.
- Books: point out shoes in books together.
- Life Skills: following directions, ex. "Get your shoes".
- Going Out: when shopping walk through the shoe section and talk about the shoes.


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First Words hot

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: talk about hot water when washing hands or taking a bath.
- Daily Activities: comment and blow on food that is hot.
- Life Skills: show your child home items that may be hot and dangerous. Careful Hot!
- Books: point to things that are hot.
- Going Out: talk about the hot sun and cool shade at the park.



in

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: when getting dressed ex. put your hand/foot/ head in.
- Play: put toys in containers, ex. shape sorters and puzzles.
- Life Skills: put dirty clothes in the laundry basket or washer.
- Life Skills: help put dishes in the dishwasher.
- Life Skills: throw garbage in the trash can.
- Going Out: getting in the car.

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

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: getting dressed put clothes on.
- Play: stack blocks.
- Play: play dress-ups, put clothes on.
- Life Skills: put dishes on the table before eating.
- Going Out: put shoes, jacket etc. on before going out.
- Going Out: at the park, ex. get on the slide, on the swings, on the ladder.





- Daily Activities: when child wants to be picked up.
- Daily Activities: walk up the stairs.

- Play: blow bubbles or throw a ball up high.
- Play: when stacking cups or blocks.
- Going Out: comment on items up high in the grocery store.

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First Words down

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: when child wants to be put down.
- Daily Activities: walk down the stairs.
- Play: during play, tip child upside down.
- Play: rolls a ball or car down a ramp.
- Play: play Ring Around the Rosie.
- Going Out: roll down a hill at the park.



First Words please

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: say "please" during snacks and meals.
- Play: before their turn during games.
- Going Out: at the park, ex. when asking to be pushed on the swing
- Going Out: when ordering at a restaurant.
- Going Out: requesting an item from the grocery store.

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First Words thank you

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: say "thank you" during snacks and meals.
- Life Skills: say "thank you" to the mailman and garbage man.
- Going Out: tell a waiter or waitress "thank you" at a restaurant.
- Going Out: after someone holds a door open for you.
- Going Out: at a library, ex. tell a librarian "thank you" for the books.

Ideas for when to use me or mine:

- Daily Activities: during snacks and meals, ex. "Who would like crackers?"
- Daily Activities: in front of a mirror, point and ask "Who's that?".
- Play: when playing games, ask "Who's turn is it?"
- Books: point to pictures of your child in photo albums, ask "Who's that?"



- Books: point to pictures of yourself in photo albums, ask "Who's this?"




Ideas for when to use this word:

- Going Out: saying "bye" to people you know in your community, ex. Librarian.

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: during snacks and meals, ex. "Do you want milk?"
- Daily Activities: during bath time ask before throwing toys in ex. "Duck in?".
- Play: play, "Do you want kisses?" and give kisses.
- Going Out: at a restaurant, ask if they would like items on the menu, ex. "Do you want French fries?"

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

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: during snacks and meals, ex. "Do you want more?"
- Daily Activities: be silly and give them someone else's shoes, ex. "Is this your shoe?"
- Play: hide objects and say "no" in places you do not find it, ex. "Under the pillow? No"
- Life Skills: practice "no touching" around hot and sharp things.
- Books: Find books that target no ex. No David, Where's Spot?

- Life Skills: following directions, ex. "Get the little fork".
- Books: point to pictures that are little, ex. little mouse, little kitten. little flower.


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First Words big

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: play the How Big is Baby? game. You say, "How big is (child's name) and see if your child will imitate you holding arms out and say "Sooo big!".
- Life Skills: following directions, ex. "Get the big cup".
- Books: point to pictures that are big, ex. big elephant, big balloon, big truck.

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Play: play with toy cars and trucks.
- Play: sit your child on your lap and pretend you are driving in a car.
- Books: talk about the cars you see in your favorite books.
- Going Out: comment about getting in and out of the car.
- Going Out: point to cars you see driving in your neighborhood.

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First Words bed

Ideas for when to use this word:

- Daily Activities: talk about going to bed before naps and at night.
- Life Skills: have your child help you take off dirty sheets and make the bed.
- Play: pretend play with dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, plastic animals, favorite characters.
- Books: look for people and animals going to bed in books.
